



Candle Manufacturer EAP Innovations Signs Three-Year Lease Extension to Remain at Mt. Pleasant Glass Centre

Lease extension keeps facility at full occupancy

GREENSBURG, PA, March 19, 2021 — The Board of Directors of the Westmoreland County Industrial Development Corporation has approved a three-year lease extension for [EAP Innovations](#) to continue to use approximately 17,000 SF space in Buildings 100 C and 100D at Mt. Pleasant Glass Centre. The agreement — which includes an optional two-year extension term — takes effect April 1, 2021.

A candle manufacturing operation that moved to Westmoreland County in 2014, EAP Innovations currently employs 21 workers.

“With the signing of this lease, we look forward to marking our 10-year milestone as a proud member of the Westmoreland County business community,” said EAP Innovations President Jeff Knapton.

Although the candle manufacturer serves an international client base, it offers local customers the opportunity to pick up online orders. Knapton said the manufacturer expects to begin holding a monthly “warehouse sale” for local customers.

Located along Route 31 in Mt. Pleasant, the 142,681 SF Mount Pleasant Glass Centre is currently at full occupancy with seven tenants that employ 110 workers.

“The manufacturing sector employs nearly 18,000 people in Westmoreland County, and a majority of those jobs are with small businesses such as EAP Innovations,” said Jason Rigone, WCIDC executive director. “The WCIDC is proud to support EAP Innovations, other manufacturers and the county economy by developing industrial parks.”
